

Research Activities: Scholarships

Since 2005, **the ACIS** provided fellowships and other financial support for students and young scholars in an estimated amount of \$460,000. These include 29 PhD students, 23 MA Students, 3 Postdoc Students, and 4 visiting scholars.

- In 2020-2021 the ACIS granted research scholarships in the sum of 38,000 NIS:

- In cooperation with the International MA program in Security and Diplomacy, the center granted 7000 NIS to a MA student: Jacob Zucker.

ACIS Director (2019-)

As of August 1, 2019 Dr. Liora Hendelman-Baavur serves as the director of the ACIS. These passing two academic years, she has participated in more than a dozen academic and professional sessions, organized and co-organized series of local and international webinars and hosted others on behalf of **TAU Alumnae**, including an international webinar with the screen writers of the acclaimed Israeli Television thriller 'Tehran.' She is regularly invited to radio and Israeli news shows as an expert on Iran, and participated in **KAN-11** production 'Enemies' in the sixth episode which was dedicated to the profile of Ayatollah Khomeini. In addition, between July 20-July 21 Dr. Hendelman-Baavur was invited as a guest speaker to events organized by Israel's Prime Minister office, the foreign office and three events of the Ministry of education, including a lecture at the **National Security College of the Israel Defense Forces**.

A more detailed report of her lectures and public appearances: In July 9, 2020 Dr. Hendelman-Baavur participated in an online book discussion organized by **the Middle East Institute in New Delhi**, where she introduced her book *Creating the Modern Iranian Woman: Popular Culture between Two Revolution* published by Cambridge University Press, 2019. The same month she participated in a special session of *China in the Mid-Med: Continuity and Security*, promoted by **the MDC, the Dept. of Asian Studies at TAU and Torino University**. In August 2020 she participated in podcast of *Big History, in Short* followed by her participation in an online workshop of the Biennial conference of the International Society for Iranian Studies on *Exile, Gender and Iran*. On September 9, she presented a



paper in virtual webinar series organized by **the Van Leer Jerusalem Institute**: *Hopa Hopa here It's not Europe: Queer and LGBT in the Middle East*, where she discussed the Mohammad Reza Shah's controversial biography.

On November 19, 2020 she presented a paper on memory and the anesthetization of the Iran-Iraq War in the fifth panel of the virtual series she co-organized with Dr. Ronen Zeidel commemorating 40 years to the outbreak of the Iran-Iraq War. In December she gave a lecture on the occasion of **the Sino-Israel Global Network and Academic Leadership** (SIGNAL) 10th anniversary: Online Masterclass "The World will Carry us: Past & Present of Iran-Israel Relations from Socio-Cultural Perspective." She also presented a paper in a joint session of the MDC and the **University of Tokyo** about *Iran and China Relations following the US Presidential elections: East Asia and the Middle East between the Coronavirus and the Sino-American Rivalry*. The same month she also presented a paper on Iran as an Island of Stability in the Middle East at the annual conference of **the Western Galilee College** in Israel which focused on the Gulf region following the signing of Abraham Accords.

In January 2021 Dr. Hendelman-Baavur presented a paper on "Denial, Resistance and Muzzling: The Pandemic and Crises Management in Iran" at the panel of **Forum Bear** on the Corona and Governing in the Middle East. She also participated in an online webinar organized by the **Washington DC- Gulf International Forum** (GIF) on the topic of the JCPOA: A Race to Save Diplomacy. Also, on January 2021, she was a guest speaker at **TAU Alumnae webinar** organized for on the occasion of the US presidential elections.

On March she gave the lecture titles: "Against All Odds: Contesting Women's Rights in Iran," as the guest speaker on the sidelines of the Human Rights Council 46th Session hosted by the permanent mission of Israel to the **United Nations in Geneva**. She also presented the paper: "Royal hype: The Court's Efforts to Popularize the Pahlavis in the Media," in a **UCLA Workshop: Pahlavi State & Society**. On May 5, 2021 she presented a paper on changes and continuity in Tehran as a mega city at the 4th session of the online lecture series **Lunch Break in Tehran**, she co-organized with the Nehemia Levzion Center for Islamic Studies and the Chaim Herzog Center for Middle East Studies and Diplomacy.

On June 1, she presented a paper titled: "Write to Women, Sell to Men: Gender and Class in Iranian Women Journals" at **the Middle East & Islamic Studies Association of Israel** (MEISAI) 44th annual conference in a panel she co-organized with Prof. Noga Efrati on Women and Newspapers in the Middle.

Alongside these activities, Dr. Hendelman-Baavur organized, co-organized and hosted additional online events, including a book session with Dr. Eric Lob of the University of Miami; a 7-session series marking 40 years to the outbreak of the Iran-Iraq War; together with Hadasa-Brandeis a book session hosting award winning writer Jaqueline Saper; with TAU's S. Daniel Abraham Center for International and Regional Studies, she hosted a panel on the 2021 Presidential elections in Iran with guest speaker Alex Vatanka, and later that year hosted te ACIS annual conference on Iranian Jews in Israel.

Publications: Dr. Hendelman-Baavur's paper "A Movement without Leadership, A Leadership without a Movement without: Women and Protest in Iran," was published in the periodical *Zmanin*, which is dedicated to the topic of 40 years to the Islamic Revolution. Another paper she authored on the emergence and celebration of Fatima Zahra as a martyr in Iran, was published in a book volume edited by Meir Hatina and Israel Gershoni, in honor of prof. Immanuel Sivan. She authored two Zman Iran article, in September 2020 on the fashion of the religious leadership in the Islamic Republic, and on April 2021 on the reactions in Iran to the 25-years agreement with China. She also authored the section on Iran in the Annual Report on Worldwide Antisemitism of the Kantor Center for the Study of Contemporary European Jewry at TAU.

Teaching: Dr. Hendelman-Baavur is teaching a pre-seminar course on the Modern History of Iran; and a course on Popular Culture in Middle East at the BA program of the Department of Middle East and African History at Tel Aviv University.

This Summer and upcoming Autumn (2022) she was elected to participate in an Exchange Program for Scholars on Foreign Policy, organized by the U.S. State Department, hosted by the University of Delaware.
